This year marks the 500th anniversary of the Battle of Flodden. This is one of the most famous of the Scottish battles. Casualties at Flodden were Yours aye, very heavy and amongst the 10,000 who were killed were twelve earls, thirteen barons, five heirs to titles, Arabella three bishops, two abbots and even the Battle of Flodden Field

King himself. I only know of two Kincaids mentioned in relation to Flodden. The first is a James Kincaid who fell in battle. This is recorded in The Scottish Antiquary vol 13 (The Flodden death roll) and on a happier note Thomas Kincaid of Coates (the same Thomas Kincaid who was Constable of years). He was also Master of Works for King James IV at least in 1511. He oversaw preparations made at James, we all owe you a debt of gratitude for all you Edinburgh Castle for the invasion of England in 1513, including the casting of some of the great cannons used in the Battle of Flodden Field.

2012 Financial Report

Preface: Life Membership dues received since 1 January 2011 are maintained in a Life Membership Fund separate from the Operating Fund. At the close of each calendar year, the Life Member fund is updated to reflect the dues received during that year and five percent of each Life Member's dues are transferred back to the Operating Fund. The Operating Fund receives all deposits of funds received by the Association (primarily annual dues and Wee Shopper purchases) and pays all necessary operating expenses of the Association.

Our Wells Fargo account balance on 1 January 2012 was \$4841.10 (USD). The Life Member Fund Balance was \$1187.50 and the Operating Fund balance was \$3653.60. Income and expenditures for 2012 were as follows.



What are those limits? In 2003 we had two luxury coaches for the Core Tour and one for the Extended Tour. It would be wonderful if we could do the same in 2014.

Ronnie Pook of Scotland Tours (www.scotland-tours.com) will be working with his team of professionals to ensure a spectacular tour filled with many memorable experiences for both the veteran traveler and the novice tourist.

We do like to sign-up new members at our tent and we are happy to add \$2 per month, from us, to their applications so that they can receive a full, next year, membership and not be invoiced for the following year before they even receive their first issue of The Defender.

I will be seventy-seven yrs. old in March and because time is getting short for me to be able to climb those ladders at "Mesa Verde" we plan to go to the Southwest this spring and summer in our motorhome. However, we are also planning to get to as many Scottish Games as we can, starting with the Ardenwood Games in Newark CA. in April.

A number of local churches have "Kirkin'-o-the-Tartan" ceremonies each fall and this year we attended one at an Episcopal (American Anglican) Church near here. It was surprising to see so many people there in a kilt or wearing tartan.

We were proud to represent the Kincaid clan and shout our name at our turn.
