The Chief's Column — Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid

Fellow Kincaids, Kinsfolk, Friends,

It is good to be sitting down to write this Advent with the anticipation and hope of Christmas not too far away for us all – that pivotal moment in history when the Godhead took on flesh and came among us.

Here in Britain, we are in the strange position of waiting to hear how the politicians will allow us to celebrate and whether Christmas could be 'cancelled' again this year - something unthinkable prior to March 2020 when our first lockdown began, and yet perhaps not anymore.... Christmas as we all know it has not always been celebrated as such in Scotland, only becoming a bank holiday in 1871, and a public holiday as recently as 1958. Christmas was in fact banned entirely in Scotland during the Scottish Reformation. In 1640 celebrating Christmas in any way was made illegal by not one, but two Acts of Parliament. This even extended to not being allowed to bake mince pies! The bakers of the day got around the laws by making their pies smaller (the size we know today) so they were easier to hide.

Celebrating the birth of Jesus became more mainstream in Scotland from the 11th century when the teachings of the Catholic Church had become the primary spiritual force of peoples' lives in the country. Prior to that, there was a 12-day celebration of Yule, a tradition that finds its roots with the Druids, and was then embraced by the Vikings who began settling in Scotland from around the 8th Century. People today still speak of Yuletide, although the 12 days of Yuletide have translated in the 12 days of Christmas. In Scotland the 12 days of Yule have also been known as Daft Days!

Reading about Christmas past in Scotland I found myself looking at the recipe for the Clootie dumpling (pictured below). I love the name, (taken of course from being boiled in a cloth) and remember my father would always call a cloth a Clootie. I must confess never yet to have made one myself but am now thinking that 2021 might just be the first year we eat a Clootie dumping for our Christmas pudding!






