The Chief's Column — Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid

Fellow Kincaids, Kinsfolk, Friends,

It's Christmas time again. A joy! In the very midst of all the on-going turmoil in Britain over Brexit, Climate Change and Global Politics it is time to celebrate the incarnation and reflect once again on the common ground on which we stand. The Christmas nativity school play is always one of the highlights of my December and this Wednesday I will be at Kalula's (now 9 years old) school for this very occasion, followed by singing carols and a jolly festive evening before the Christmas holidays begin. I love the way small children bring truths we know so well to life again and so often the beautiful young angels with their tinsel wings and shepherds with their tea towels on their heads bring a tear to our eyes! I wanted to share a sweet Christmas story I heard of a seven year old child drawing a picture of the nativity. The picture was very good, including Mary, Joseph and of course, baby Jesus. However, there was a fat man standing in the corner of the stable that just did not seem to fit in. When the child was asked about it, she replied, 'Oh, that's Round John Virgin.'

We will be thinking of Kincaids everywhere as we all gather at home for Christmas in the next few days as schools and universities break up. Then the fun begins, the parties, the shopping and decorating and cooking and baking and perhaps a Christmas Quiz... I have just learned that St Nicholas (fore-runner of Santa Claus as we all know) was a fourth century Christian bishop who gave away his abundant inheritance to help the needy and rescued women from servitude! Extraordinary to think that his benevolence hundreds of years ago became the starting point for an annual global phenomenon. Surely an encouragement to us all to keep on with the seemingly small kindnesses; who knows where they will lead over time.

Being 2018 we, in the UK, have had a year of commemorating the end of the Great War exactly 100 years ago. Kalula has just been working on projects to do with both the First and Second World War. Although it sounds so long ago it really is almost within touching distance... My Kincaid-Lennox great grandmother's only brother, Colin Donald, was tragically killed in action in July of 1918 in France. Almost everyone over here in Britain has a family member not so far back who gave their life in the cause of freedom from tyranny - but we would not and could not have managed it without our American friends coming to join us in pursuit of this end. Of course, in this regard, the same was true of the Second World War. One Thomas Cassin Kinkaid

served in both World Wars; firstly in WW1 as a naval attaché in London working with the British Admiralty, and in the Second World War he served in the Pacific rising to the rank of Admiral. He was clearly a man of outstanding and upright character.

“The annals of war at sea present no more intense, heart-shaking shock than these two battles (Coral Sea and Midway) in which the qualities of the United States Navy and Air Force and of the American race shone forth in splendour. The novel and hitherto utterly unmeasured conditions which air warfare had created made the speed of action and the twists of fortune more intense than has ever been witnessed before. But the bravery and self-devotion of the American airmen and sailors and the nerve and skill of their leaders were the foundation of all.”
Taken from The Second World War, Winston S. Churchill, Volume IV – The Hinge of Fate, London, 1951, page 216.

Admiral Kinkaid was one of those Leaders.

Samuel Marcus Kinkead, who Bill Kincaid dedicates a whole chapter to in ‘This I’ll Defend’, was an outstanding Pilot in the First World. He was decorated multiple times for his gallantry bravery and skill and known for being keen, plucky, excellent, brilliant.... Undoubtedly many more Kincaids have served bravely and selflessly and equally brilliantly throughout the World Wars and since then also. We **will** remember them with deep gratitude and profound respect. We live in the freedom they gave their very lives for.

On a different and brighter note altogether and with 2019 just around the corner we have a Clan Gathering to look forward to! Hearty thanks and much appreciation go to James Brisbin and Hugh Kincaid for taking on the herculean task of organising a wonderful few days for us all at Grandfather Mountain Highland Games, and Gathering of Scottish Clans in July. I have heard so much about the Games from a number of people and it has all been very good! The Torchlight Ceremony to open the Games with a living cross of light recognising the Saltire Cross as Scotland’s ancient symbol sounds quite breath-taking and that is just the beginning of what looks to be a really wonderful few days. We, as a family, are all looking forward to being able to celebrate our shared heritage and bonds of kinship together very much indeed!

Term of Office: Newly elected officers will serve a term of three years beginning 1 January 2020.

Those Eligible to vote: Any Clan Member in good standing by 1 June 2019 will be eligible to vote. The Membership Secretary will identify those Clan members eligible to vote in the election.

Application Procedures:

1. *Letter of Intent:* Potential additional candidates who wish to be placed on the ballot must submit a letter of intent for a specific position. The Letter of Intent shall include a personal biography and statement of their goals if elected. Letters of intent shall be limited to 500 words and shall be deemed to be public domain and authorized for publication in *The Defender* newsletter and on the Clan Kincaid website.

2. *Letter of Intent Due Date:* Clan members must submit their Letter of Intent to the Secretary of the Association no later than 1 May 2019. Letters arriving later than 11:59 PM, 1 May 2019 will not be accepted.

3. *Ballots Provided the Clan Membership:* Ballots with Letters of Intent and voting instructions will be provided to the Clan Membership in the June 2019 issue of *The Defender* newsletter.

- Completed Ballots must be sent to the designated election individual (to be announced) no later than 1 September 2019; however, ballots arriving between 1 and 15 September bearing a 1 September 2019 postmark will be counted.

- Any ballot arriving after 15 September 2019 will not be counted.

4. *New Board Member Announcement:* The Clan Kincaid President will announce the new Clan Kincaid Board of Officers in the December 2019 issue of *The Defender* newsletter.

"Come One – Come All"

The "Highlands" of western North Carolina beckon to all clans and especially Clan Kincaid this coming July 11-14 for the 64th Annual **Grandfather Mountain Highland Games.**

The festivities will begin Thursday, July 11 with Scotch tasting in the afternoon followed by Picnicking at McCrea Meadows (bring your own or vendors available) along with Celtic entertainment and sheep herding. The evening will see the moving Torchlight Ceremony as each Clan will be welcomed to **"The Gathering of the Clans"**. As the **"Honoured Clan"** for 2019, the ceremony will be led by **Clan Kincaid and its Chief – Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid.**

Friday's festival activities begin at 9:00 AM and continue until 4:00 PM with all your traditional favourites including piping competitions, heavy events, dancing, sheep trials, genealogy tents, history and folklore tents, children's activities, Scottish cultural activities and, of course, the largest gathering of clans in North America with over 100 clans represented on the Avenue of the Clans. Your home away from home will be the Clan Kincaid Tent where you will find fellowship, reunions, rest, refreshments, clan history, Kincaid displays and more.

Friday evening there will be a special **"Meet and Greet"** where all can gather over a 'wee dram' or pint of their favourite brew and enjoy meeting new Kincaids and their families along with renewing old friendships. The highlight of the evening will be an opportunity to have casual conversation with our Chief – Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid.

Saturday's festival activities again begin in the morning and close at 4:00 PM. In addition to Friday's activities, there will be massed bands, the Official Opening Ceremony, fiddling and harp competitions, highland wrestling, and lots of vendors purveying a variety of Scottish goods and treats for every pallet.

The Highlight of the weekend will be the **"Grand Clan Kincaid Gala Banquet"** honouring our Clan Chief – Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid and her family. The Gala will take place at the Best Western Mountain Lodge at Banner Elk, North Carolina. A social time will begin at 6:00 PM with and group photo planned for 6:45 and Dinner at 7:00 PM. A Little Bit of This and That

Kincaid Park, Anchorage Alaska USA- Karen Davis, Chief Commissioner (L-101)

Kincaid Park, one of the most popular parks in Anchorage, is a scenic 1,517 acre municipal park located at the end of Raspberry Road on the site of a former Cold War missile base. The park was originally used as a Nike-Hercules missile storage site during the 1950s. The land was transferred to Anchorage in 1980 to be developed as a park. Today, you can still find concrete missile silos converted to storages. The park offers year round activities including over 30 miles of cross country skiing, biking and hiking trails together with archery, golf, soccer, motorcross, lakes, beaches and sand

dunes. As if that isn't enough, there is proliferate wildlife viewing of moose, bear and birds. The park is set amid panoramic views of Denali and the vast Cook Inlet offering photographers a chance to snap that award winning photo. Kincaid Park was named for Ralph Kincaid (1907-1953) the founder of Granite Products Inc, later known as Kincaid and King Construction, which was responsible for contributing equipment and services for the construction of several playing fields and playgrounds throughout Anchorage. 
