The Chief's Column — Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid

Fellow Kincaids, Kinsfolk, Friends,

The very opening words must be addressed to Emily, our Defender Editor, to wish you all the best for the next precious few weeks especially as you welcome a new little person into your family! A miracle every time, new life - with all the love, joy and hope that comes with it.

I have just been away, together with Giles and our youngest (Kalula), to Durham for a mini break and to see Angus. Whilst we were there we went to an evensong at the Cathedral. It is hard to find the words to describe Durham Cathedral. The sheer magnificence of the place is overwhelming and the history that we can imbibe so easily thanks to the information available is hard to take in in just one visit. I mention this because I was struck forcibly with the impact of what can be achieved, built upon and embellished throughout many generations of people who have invested into a place, family, cause, dynasty etc. The visible structure of the Cathedral is there for all to see and it has been a place of worship and welcome for almost a millennium and housed therein is the grave of St Cuthbert (one of the most important medieval saints in the North of England with a cult centred on his tomb) and also the Venerable Bede (who is also known as the Father of English History). Clan Kincaid has been a recognised force in the world for almost a millennium as well. Our influence has been dispersed over the millennia, rather than concentrated in one place like Durham Cathedral but as I came away from the beautiful choral evensong of soaring harmonies and lifted hearts, thinking of the flow of love and light through the generations of worshippers in that place. We Kincaids have, through the generations, carried the bloodlines of our warrior forbears, brave Jacobites and loyal servants of the Monarch. From Scotland these qualities of goodness of heart, strength, loyalty and more have gone out to serve the world, with all those wonderful qualities in which we live today.

With only a few short months until the Gathering at Grandfather Mountain it is really lovely to think that so many of us extended family will be able to spend a few days together in the beauty of the Mountains. So much to look forward to and so much to celebrate. James Brisbin and Hugh Kincaid are putting together a wonderful programme of events for us all to enjoy and I am looking forward to being able to spend time at the Clan Tent and enjoying the festival together. We gather

as kindred, family, and cousins and it is all possible because of each and every person who volunteers, giving of themselves in many different ways through their generosity of time, resources, gifts, and skills. Profound thanks is due to everyone working on this. Within our number, on this occasion, I am very delighted to let you know that we have our very own Reverend John Kinkead officiating as our Chaplain for the duration of the Festival, which is a great blessing.

Recently a Lennox Clan Society has been born and along with that a project is springing up to proclaim support for the preservation of Lennox Castle and the hope is to eventually inject some life into it once again. For those of us who have been there we know that this is a monumentally large project. As many of you will know, in the 1830's, a Glasgow architect called David Hamilton was commissioned by John Lennox Kincaid Lennox to design a new house in the style of a Norman castle. Lennox Castle was duly designed and built but was only lived in for a few generations. World War 1 was the beginning of the end for many old family run estates and homes in Britain. The Castle became a military hospital during the Great War and only a few short years later the Castle was sold in 1927 to the City of Glasgow. The Castles' descent into ruin happened quite quickly even as it was still within living memory of a few to have lived in it. My Grandmother, Madam Heather, remembers being taken up to the Castle to see her Grandmother when she was a small child. I remember her telling me that she herself remembered the smart new shoes she was wearing on one visit. Lennox Castle is an important building for both the Lennox and Kincaid because it was really out of the union of John Kincaid of Kincaid and Cecilia Lennox, that the idea for this building and its subsequent creation came about. On that basis we, as Kincaids are invited to be a part of this great plan. Time will tell how this plays out but, watch this space for development!

Looking forward to the onset of Spring and the countdown to our 2019 Gathering in July.



A Message from the President



I want to remind Clan Kincaid Members that year 2019 will be an election year.

Board of Officers to be elected:

President (Incumbent David Kincaid)
 Membership Secretary (Incumbent Donna Knauss)
 Secretary (Incumbent Linda Hoskins)
 Treasurer (Incumbent Christopher Kinthead)
 Communications Director (Incumbent Emily Silversparre)
 Wee Shopper Manager (Incumbent Rick Kincaid)
 Chief Commissioner (Incumbent: Karen Davis)

Term of Office: Newly elected officers will serve a term of three years beginning 1 January 2020.

Those Eligible to vote: Any Clan Member in good standing by 1 June 2019 will be eligible to vote. The Membership Secretary will identify those Clan members eligible to vote in the election.

Application Procedures:

Letter of Intent: Potential additional candidates who wish to be placed on the ballot must be a member in good standing and submit a letter of intent for a specific position. The Letter of Intent shall include a personal biography and statement of their goals if elected. Letters of intent shall be limited to 500 words and shall be deemed to be public domain and authorized for publication in *The Defender* newsletter and on the Clan Kincaid website.

Letter of Intent Due Date: Clan members must submit their Letter of Intent to the Secretary of the Association or President no later than 1 May 2019. Letters arriving later than 11:59 PM, 1 May 2019 will not be accepted.

Ballots Provided the Clan Membership: Ballots with Letters of Intent and voting instructions will be provided to the Clan Membership in the August/September 2019 issue of *The Defender* newsletter.

Completed Ballots must be sent to the designated election Officer (Steve Nesbitt, address will be provided on Ballot) no later than 1 October 2019; however, ballots arriving between 1 and 15 October bearing a 1 October 2019 postmark will be counted.

Any ballot arriving after 15 October 2019 will not be counted.

New Board Member Announcement: The Clan Kincaid President will announce the new Clan Kincaid Board of Officers in the December 2019 issue of *The Defender* newsletter.

The Clan Kincaid Gathering 2019 - Grandfather Mountain, Boone NC USA

The Countdown to the Clan Kincaid Gathering 2019 at Grandfather Mountain, North Carolina continues. July 11th to 14th will be upon us in just 4 more months and already the excitement is building toward what promises to be a most extraordinary experience and perhaps the biggest Clan Kincaid event ever.

With over 100 days left we already have confirmed registrations at our host hotel of 56 Kincaids and over 30 have purchased their Gala Tickets.

Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid has confirmed her attendance as the Honoured Chief of our Honoured Clan. She will be traveling from her home in Shropshire, England with her two sons, Angus and Dominic.

The Grandfather Mountain Scottish Festival is one of the biggest Scottish events in North America with an annual attendance of 30,000 and the largest contingent of Clans. (Last year saw 118 clans march in the "Parade of Clans") **This year the Parade of Clans will be led by Clan Kincaid** and we hope to have well over 100 attendees to march in support of our Chief who will be reviewing the Parade. How proud she will be in having the largest group of any of the clans!

The festival will have all the traditional Scottish events available for your enjoyment. There will be athletic events like the caber toss, sheaf toss, weight for distance, Scottish wrestling, and racing. Musical competitions will include solo piping and pipe bands, harpists, singing in Gaelic and lots of dancers performing the highland fling, sword dance, jigs, hornpipes and reels. There will be a "Gaelic Mod" where volunteers can come forward and compete in Gaelic singing. There will be a clan torch lighting ceremony and a huge Clan Parade awaiting for your entertainment. There will also be a special "Kirkin of the Tartan" church service where the tartans of the various clans will be blessed. Then there are all the vendors who will ply you with foods and treats galore and the many vendors who might supply you with all sorts of Scottish wares from kilts to weapons to jewelry for your shopping enjoyment.

Waiting for your relaxation will be the Clan Kincaid Tent where you can come sit for a while, enjoy a snack or a "wee dram" and converse with your many old and new kinfolk. There will be a Clan Kincaid "Meet and Greet" where you can share a drink and chat about all things Kincaid and get to know our Chief on a more personal and casual note.

The highlight of the weekend will be the Grand Gala where you will have the opportunity to dress up formally for a great feast. Yes – We hope to have Haggis! Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid will be presenting the Keynote Address and President David Kincaid will bring us up to date on your Clan Kincaid Association International. There will be entertainment and a large selection of door prizes donated by members of your Clan.

Whether this will be your first Clan Kincaid Gathering or maybe you have attend others in the past, this will be unique and truly memorable event. You will not want to miss this opportunity.

A Little Bit of This and That

Kincaid-Anderson Plantation, South Carolina- Karen Davis, Chief Commissioner (L-101)

Located at 7430 Landis Road, Jenkinsville in Fairfield County, South Carolina, the Kincaid-Anderson House was named for James Kincaid and the Anderson descendants of his daughter. James Kincaid was a Captain in the American Revolution and was also recognized as an agricultural innovator by locally promoting the tomato as a food. Additionally, Captain Kincaid was a well known religious leader involved in the establishment of the Ebenezer Church and he was a member of the South Carolina House of Representatives. Commonly reported folklore states that Captain Kincaid actually invented the cotton gin and that Eli Whitney visited Captain Kincaid to study and make drawings of Kincaid's machine from which Whitney made a model and then secured the patent. Whether that is true or not is merely speculation.

Captain Kincaid acquired this property as a land grant from King George III and built his Georgian style mansion in 1774. It was placed on the National Registry on July 30, 1974. A blue granite wall mined from a nearby quarry that was developed by the Andersons from a portion of the plantation, encloses the grounds of the property. The quarry remained in operation until 1946. Following the Andersons ownership, the plantation fell to Dan Heyward and his wife, who were responsible for restoring the house and gardens. It remained in their care until their deaths in the 1960s. The house then stood vacant, but by 1974 E. Crosby Lewis was its owner and by 2015 the plantation was up for sale once more. During its long history and at different times, this home was also called Heyward Hall, The Castle, and The Cedars. It is still under private ownership. 
