

### Lennox Castle—James Brisbin (L-91)

The year 1800 saw the marriage of John Kincaid of that Ilk and Cecilia Lennox. Thus were merged two great



families. The Kincaids of Campsie were recorded as early as the 13<sup>th</sup> century and the ancient Lennox family held the earldom between Loch Lomond and Dumbarton dating from the early 1200s. John and Cecilia presumably settled onto married life in Kincaid House (now the Kincaid House Hotel and Wedding Venue) which was rebuilt in 1812. To John and Cecilia was born a son, John Lennox Kincaid who succeeded his aunt in 1831 as Chief of the Lennox and changed his surname to Kincaid-Lennox. In 1832 he succeeded his father as Kincaid of Kincaid.

As a great landowner in the Parrish of Campsie, John Len-

nox Kincaid-Lennox called upon the services of the Glasgow Architect, David Hamilton, to construct a home befitting the family's rank and position. Thus between 1837 and 1841 was Lennox Castle constructed. Unfortunately, the cost of building such a beautiful stately home became a burden to the family who were only to enjoy its opulence for 80 years when the castle was finally sold to pay debts and consolidate holdings elsewhere in Britain.



Lennox Castle became a hospital and continued as such until the early 1990s when it was sold and began to deteriorate. Arsonists set fire to the Castle in 2008 and it now stands in ruins awaiting decisions as to its future. The quartered arms of Kincaid and Lennox still proudly adorn the front entrance of Lennox Castle.

Treasurer's 2019 Financial Report /Proposed 2020 Budget – Topher Kinkead Submitted his 2019 financial report showing operating fund beginning balance at \$6,816.66, income \$5,695.00, expenses \$4400.86 and ending balance at \$8,110.80. Savings account beginning balance \$4777.10, income \$1000.57, and ending balance at \$5,777.67. Total Operating fund and saving balance is \$13,888,47.

Wee Shopper Financial Report – Rick Kincaid reported that Income for 2019 was \$3,095.53 and Expenses \$3,466.46. Counting the beginning balance the Ending Balance for 2019 is \$5,494.53.

Rick also reported that Brig. Bill's book "This I'll Defend" has been reprinted and digital copies are available online.

Membership Report/List of Members – Donna Knauss reported that as a Clan we continue to grow. In 2019 we had 28 active family members (9 new and 9 converted from annual memberships). Of the 137 active Life members 7 were new members. Of the 131 active Annual members 16 were new. Renewal reminder notices have been sent to annual and family members. We already have 2 new family memberships and 6 new annual memberships for 2020.




