### Constitution Changes—Please Vote! - Hugh Kincaid Clan President (L-175)

In the previous "Defender" issue, the Board of Officers presented four proposals for changes to the Clan Kincaid Association International constitution. It's now your chance to take action! As per our constitution's rules, it's essential that our members give their approval for any changes made to it. Pleases review the below summaries. Voting instructions are at the end of the page.

Here is a recap of the propose changes:

### PROPOSAL 1

### Increase reimbursement for CKAI event fees

Change the Constitution Article VIII, Section 802, Sub-section E to read:

Volunteers will need to personally fund the event(s) in which they choose to participate. It is permissible to solicit financial support and assistance from Association members attending an event. A Commissioner may be reimbursed up to two hundred and fifty (250) dollars for event registration fees associated with hosting Kincaid activities at such events. The submission of an official event receipt is required.

### PROPOSAL 2

### Creation of by-laws to facilitate the effective and efficient operation of CKAI

Change the Constitution, Article IV, Section 405 by adding the following sub-section (b):

The Board of Officers shall create and amend by-laws to guide and facilitate the effective and efficient operation of the Association. These by-laws shall be approved by the Board of Officers by single second and simple majority vote and shall be maintained by the Secretary.

### PROPOSAL 3

### Creation of the Event Host position

Change the Constitution, Article VIII to include the new position of Event Host with fewer responsibilities than Commissioners.

The necessary constitutional changes will be developed by the Chief Commissioner during 2023 and will be presented for approval by the Board of Officers during a special session meeting.

### PROPOSAL 4

### Removal of the restriction for Board Members serving on the Chief's Advisory Council

Change Constitution, Article VI, Section 601, Sub-section D that restricts Board of Officers from serving on the Chief's Advisory Council.

Delete Subsection D that reads:

Members of the Advisory Council shall not be members of the Board of Officers.

## Utah Scottish Association Games & Payson Scottish Festival<sup>AGE 7</sup>

Greetings and Salutations to all Utah Members of Clan Kincaid Association International. It has been a wonderful games season to meet all of you. We were at the Utah Scottish Association Games in Salt Lake City, Utah on June 16, 17, 18th. I had the privilege of representing Clan Kincaid, on behalf of Madam Arabella Kincaid of Kincaid, Chieftain of our Clan, as the Honored Clan. Being introduced on stage for the opening ceremonies, it gave me great pride to represent Clan Kincaid in this fashion.







### **Chief Commissioner Report**

Hello to all Clan Kincaid Association, International Members and friends of Clan Kincaid,

Our records recovery from the Covid shut down continues. We had one current commissioner recently check in. Welcome back Missouri Commissioner Teresa Coles!

Progress is slowly being made on the assignments that each board member received from our Annual General Membership meeting that lasted so long this year. I have begun reaching out to our Commissioner's for their input into the writing of our By-laws, requirements and standards. Their collective experience will be invaluable during this time of growth for CKAI.

Congratulations to our collective Commissioners! To date, our Commissioners have presented, or scheduled, more Clan Tents than last year. Commissioners, a reminder that we have raised the registration reimbursement amounts to \$250.00 per event. We pay shipping both ways for the Clan Kincaid Banners.

President Hugh, Communications Director Emily, and I are working on a new set of Clan Kincaid handouts to be used when Clan Tents are hosted. These will be finalized after our new website goes live, so they will reflect the new website that is anticipated to be live in October 2023. The new website will afford Commissioners the opportunity to directly enroll new members via smart phones on the spot at a festival rather than having to send anything in via standard mail.

We have had a benefactor come forward who offered support for Clan Kincaid Association International in the form of providing business cards for our commissioners. Thank you! I will contact each Commissioner prior to their next scheduled games to place an order, as needed. The new business cards have a changed logo and will show name, title, email contact, website and Facebook information. Inquires will have the information so they can go to our internet pages for full Clan Kincaid information. Handouts will be greatly reduced, or eliminated.

As our Board of Officers recognizes the need to protect personal information of our membership, I have begun sending out blind email notices to our General Membership where Clan Kincaid will be represented at Highland gatherings. You will receive blind email notices when a Clan Kincaid tent is being hosted near your home town, and/or when a Commissioner will be at an event near you. This is as an alternative to sending notices community wide for every game or gathering.

On behalf of our Board of Officers and by appointment by Madam Arabella Kincaid, of Kincaid, I am privileged to introduce you to our new Indiana Commissioner Ricci Kincaid. 
### Grandfather Mountain Highland Games - Hugh Kincaid, Clan President (L-174)
